The first 12 Battalion Magazine was produced for 2nd Intake in 1953. I was browsing this a few weeks ago and came across a small article that caught my attention.

L/Cpl Blanchard was the designer of the cover the 12 Battalion Magazine and therefore indirectly responsible for the design of the MIGHTY 12TH Badge. He is not on our register and I have no idea where he came from or as I said, whether he is still with us. Maybe one of you guys has some further info. We have very few 1953 intake guys registered.

Following the last email and post out, I received 1 returned- not at this address and about 25 bounced emails. This time I have decided to send all copies by snail mail- a bloody big task- and request that email bods, send me an email so that I can reformat my members who use that method of correspondence. Have you seen the "Battle for Australia" book I mentioned in the September news. We have sold over 3000 of these and the War memorial has picked up an option on sales at their bookshop. The book is \$6.50 including postage from me and worth 4 times that amount at least. The maps alone have to be seen to be believed and the text is easy reading.

Did you ever wonder what the "purpose of National Service was? Here is the extract from the Department of Labour and National Service

National Service Manual.

National Service Act. 1951. Purpose of National Service.

"The National Service Act 1951 provides National Service Training for young men reaching the age of 18 years. The purpose of the N/S Act is twofold. The first is to make a contribution to the defence of Australia by

providing a reserve of trained men who will be available for service with the Defence force in the case of an emergency.

The second is to improve the health and physical fitness of young men by giving them a period of regular disciplined training and also, through medical examination, bringing to notice any physical conditions that need medical attention.”

The previous bit of the newsletter was written in February with the intention of getting it posted out- “The best laid plans of mice and newsletter editors goes oft astray”

I revised some bits and let’s hope that “nothing” interferes with this posting.

I must admit that the newsletter task is becoming a bit too much for me and I wondered if there was any ex 12 Bn guy who might “pick up the sword” and carry on, otherwise our newsletter will peter out. (Some funds are still available to cover postage from donations received two years ago.)

My late father, Jim Powe (d. 20/1/09), was a member of the 1st intake of the 12th Training Battalion at 'New Holsworthy' in 1955 (6 Platoon, B Company, Hut 15). He went on to complete his National Service with the Royal NSW Lancers near his family home in Parramatta.

A keen photographer, he put together a hand-made album of several hundred photos covering both the training (Ferrets, Matildas, Brens etc) and social (eg 'Battalion Dance 11/3/55') aspects of his time with B Coy. As he is not in many of the images (and nearly all of the negatives are with the album), I presume they were taken with his personal camera.

Unfortunately, none of the people in the photos is individually named, but if there is any interest out there I would be willing to scan the images upon request.
